

Historical Method and Purpose

• 1 Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile an account of the things accomplished among us, 2 just as they were handed down to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, 3 it seemed fitting for me as well, having investigated everything carefully from the beginning, to write it out for you in consecutive order, most excellent Theophilus; 4 so that you may know the exact truth about the things you have been taught. — Luke 1:1-4

Historical Method and Purpose

• 1 The first account I composed, Theophilus, about all that Jesus began to do and teach, 2 until the day when He was taken up to heaven, after He had by the Holy Spirit given orders to the apostles whom He had chosen. 3 To these He also presented Himself alive after His suffering, by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over a period of forty days and speaking of the things concerning the kingdom of God. – Acts 1:1-3


The Source / Hermeneutic Issue in History...

Jesus' Confirmation of Moses as Historical Narrator (Literally Understood)

- "But he said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be persuaded even if someone rises from the dead." – Luke 16:31
- Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures. Luke 24:27
- Now He said to them, "These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, 46 and He said to them, "Thus it is written... Luke 24:44-46



- Synthetic bringing the pieces together (the big picture)



The Timeline: Daniel 9







Competing Chronologies


- Masoretic Text between 6th-10th century compilation of Hebrew manuscript, Genesis account matches Ussher's 4004 chronology.
- Septuagint/LXX 3rd century BC (to 132BC) account matches creation date of 5554-5390BC
- Example: Methuselah lived 187 years, and became the father of Lamech.—Gen 5:25. (LXX has 167, placing Methuselah's death 14 years after the flood)
- MT Creation 4004 Flood 2348
- LXX Creation 5554 Flood 3298


LXX Timeline
















- Key Passages

- Key Ideas
 - Literal Six Days Luke 3:38 Genealogy presented as historical, Adam from God
 - Purpose and Tasks of Humanity Pre and Post Fall (Gen 1:26-28, 2:4-25, 9:1-7)
 - The Curse: Dominionism/Stewardship/Redacted Dominionism (Gen 3:17-19)
 - Awaiting Restoration (Gen 3:15, Rom 8:18-25, Rev 19-20)
- Key Implications
 - For past, present, and future: Romans 1-5, Ephesians 2, Colossians 3:1-5





Ishmael and 12 Princes



- Genesis 17:20
- Genesis 25:12-19

"...And these are the names of the sons of Ishmael, by their names, according to their generations" (Genesis: 25:13-16).



Edom

- Name of Esau and later, his territories (Gen 25:30, 36:16)
- Judged for pride and harming Israel and Judah (Is 21:11, Jer 49:7-22, Ezek 25:12-14, Amos 1:11, Obadiah)
- Flourished until 6th century destruction by Babylon
- Afterwards in South of Judea
- Idumea in NT times (Mk 3:8)

The Tribes of Israel

Reuben - the firstborn, son of Leah

Simeon - son of Leah

Levi – son of Leah, chosen to be a priestly tribe

Judah - son of Leah, chosen to be the tribe of Messiah, southern tribe

Dan - son of Bilhah (Rachel's maid), northernmost tribe

Naphtali - son of Bilhah

Gad – son of Zilpah (Leah's maid)

Asher - son of Zilpah

Issachar - son of Leah

Zebulun - son of Leah

Joseph - first son of Rachel, favored by Jacob

Benjamin – youngest son of Jacob, by Rachel, southern tribe

Manasseh - firstborn son of Joseph, a half tribe in place of Levi


Ephraim - youngest son of Joseph, blessed by Jacob, half tribe in place of Levi

Egypt/Mizraim

- Genesis 10:6, 12:10
- 625 mentions in the Bible
- A world power in Joseph's time
- Second to Israel in Solomon's time (1 Kin 3:1, 4:21)
- Hoshea of Israel sought help from Egypt when assaulted by Assyria (2 Kin 17:1-5)
- Limited by Babylon in 6th century (2 Kin 24:7)
- Judgment (Is 19)







 - Midianites (6-9)





The Nations for Testing


• 1 Now these are the nations which the Lord left, to test Israel by them (that is, all who had not experienced any of the wars of Canaan; 2 only in order that the generations of the sons of Israel might be taught war, those who had not experienced it formerly). 3 These nations are: the five lords of the **Philistines** and all the **Canaanites** and the **Sidonians** and the **Hivites** who lived in Mount Lebanon, from Mount Baal-hermon as far as Lebo-hamath. 4 They were for testing Israel, to find out if they would obey the commandments of the Lord, which He had commanded their fathers through Moses. 5 The sons of Israel lived among the **Canaanites**, the **Hittites**, the **Amorites**, the **Perizzites**, the **Hivites**, and the **Jebusites**; – Judges 3:1-5

 - Solomonic Reiteration (1 Kin 3, 9)
 - Judgment on Solomon (Division, 1 Kin 10-11)
